Thanks to your generous support, Maine Children's Home (MCH) made a significant impact across the state of Maine:

Empowering young parents and fostering healthy parenting

Providing winter essentials to children in families facing financial hardship

Offering valuable training to educators and caregivers

Supporting birth and adoptive parents in important decisions

Facilitating thousands of mental health counseling sessions to nurture better outcomes for clients and families

In 2023, with Senator Angus King's support, we secured \$525,000 in congressional spending, propelling our response to the mental health needs in our community. This funding will enhance our clinical counseling center, services,

REACH + IMPACT

In 2023, we reached hundreds of children, youth, and families in nearly 170 towns across the state of Maine.

OUR WORK IN 2023

SUPPORTING YOUNG PARENTS

We supported 47% more young parents and pregnant youth!

More pregnant and parenting young people were provided prenatal, parenting, and life skills education through our Journey Program, helping them make informed choices and build healthy foundations for themselves and their families.

We reached *14 towns* across *five counties* with our young parent support.

SHARING JOY + WARMTH WITH FAMILIES


We provided winter essentials to **1,181 children** from **541 families**!

Our winter essentials / Christmas Program reached *141 towns* across all *16 counties* of Maine. Every child received a box of brand new warm clothing, boots, books, toys, games, and more.

GUIDING TOWARD HOPE AND HEALING

We provided **5,571 therapy sessions** to clients in **31 towns** across Maine

Our clinical counseling program — Family Counseling Center — is a state licensed outpatient mental health program and facility that provides counseling to individuals, couples, children, and families. The staff of the center are licensed clinicians qualified by their credentials, experience, and passion for mental health support.



HELPING BIRTH PARENTS + ADOPTIVE FAMILIES

We provided adoption and birth parent services in 45 Maine communities and three countries outside the United States.

The path to adopting a child is a long process that can often take more than five years. The team of social workers in our Family Adoption Program helped finalize 13% of its adoption cases, while supporting the other 87% on each step of the adoption journey.

SHARING POWERFUL CAREGIVER TOOLS

We provided **344 educators and caregivers** with trainings for supporting Maine kids.

Our trainings from our Connected Families Project reached *13 schools* across *three counties* with valuable workshops that help nurture environments where kids can thrive.

STORIES

MCH Therapist: When a child walks through our door, they know someone is here to support them



Therapy serves as a crucial space where children feel a vital sense of mattering and understanding. Recently, we recorded an interview with an MCH staff member Samantha Turner, who is a Licensed Master Social Worker, to share her explanation of the importance of therapy and "safe adults" in the lives of children. This is what Samantha had to say:

Many children who come to the counseling center at MCH are navigating disruptions in both their social and family life. Some adolescents grapple with a heavy sense of hopelessness, leading to antisocial interactions, feelings of disconnection from their community, a sense of insignificance, or even thoughts of self-harm and suicide.



The presence of a compassionate adult, like a therapist, in a child's life allows for hope and early interventions that can profoundly alter the course of their lives. For those children lacking consistent support, therapy at MCH becomes a safe place where a trusted adult is always ready to guide them through life's challenges.

In my work with children, my deepest aspiration is that our therapy sessions equip them with the resilience and skills needed not only for their current struggles but also for the challenges they may encounter in the future. In an initial session with a young client, I often playfully express that I want to be "out of a job." By this I mean: I genuinely hope that our sessions empower them to become their own strongest supporters, fostering lasting positive change in their life.



TOOLKITS FOR WELL-BEING

Every year, our winter essentials program — Christmas Program — packs hundreds of boxes of brand new warm clothing, games, books, and toys for families facing financial hardship during the winter months.

Every family is offered a *Well-Being Toolkit* sponsored by the New Balance Foundation. This coloring booklet is full of playful activities for practicing healthy habits, such as staying hydrated, eating fruits and veggies, exercising, and practicing mindfulness.






MARDEN'S RED STOCKINGS

Every year, Maine's bargain store Marden's organizes their Red Stocking Program, a fundraiser for our winter essentials program — Christmas Program

In 2023, Marden's customers and the Marden's family raised more than \$61,000 through their Red Stocking Program.

The estimated value of a box of winter essentials is around \$300 per child, which means that Marden's Red Stocking fund supports more than 200 boxes full of winter essentials for Maine kids.

Operating Expenses: \$2,120,743

FINANCIAL SUMMARY

Maine Children's Home utilized unrestricted endowment funds to support organization cash flow and to invest in much needed campus upgrades and repairs. In-Kind support is reported as revenue but is a non-cash transaction. Expenses were up in 2023 from 2022 with increases in staff salaries, increased occupancy costs (heat, electricity), and strategic investments in community and donor engagement.



WHAT'S AHEAD

TARGETED CASE MANAGEMENT

In 2024, we are offering
Targeted Case Management
(TCM) and individualized
support to identified adults and
children to help them meet
their unique life goals. In TCM,
a case manager works closely
with these individuals to: assess
their situation; create a support
plan that addresses their
needs; advocate for services
within the individual's plan; and
evaluate the effectiveness of the
individual's support plan.

THERAPY KITS

Our clinical counseling program Family Counseling Center is working with local organizations including the Waterville Rotary Club and The Friends of Maine Children's Home to put together therapy kits for young counseling clients to use during sessions. The kits include items such as: stress relief tools, affirmation cards, snacks, fidgets, and tools for expressing themselves.

EXPANDING SUPPORT FOR FAMILIES IN NEED

Our winter essentials program — Christmas Program — has historically served families with children ages 0 to 12 during the winter months. In 2024, we are expanding the age limit to include youth ages 17 and younger. We are also planning to provide other essentials throughout the year such as seasonal clothing items and accessories that support active and outdoor play for kids whose families face financial hardship.

WE TURN 125 IN 2024

Over the past 125 years, MCH has evolved from a physical refuge for children to a multifaceted organization that provides compassionate and personalized community and office-based support to hundreds of individuals statewide. Throughout the year, we will be celebrating what we've become and our vision for building more resilient communities for another 125 years.



REMODELING FOR A BRIGHTER FUTURE IN MAINE

After a request by
Senator Angus King
was approved in 2023,
we were awarded
\$525,000 of congressional
spending to support
our renovation project
designed to confront
Maine's mental health
crisis. The project will be
completed this year and
involves the addition of
trauma-informed and
sensory spaces for our
clinical counseling center.
